

# Methodology


- 300 telephone interviews conducted with a randomly selected representative sample of Camrose residents aged 18 years or older.
- Interviews conducted between May 16 and June 9, 2013.
- Final data was weighted to ensure the age/gender distribution reflects that of the actual population in Camrose according to the most recent Census data.
- Overall results are accurate to within ±5.7 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
   The margin of error will be larger for sample subgroups.
- Where comparable, this year's results have been tracked and reported against past surveys to understand how attitudes and priorities have changed and assess the City's progress in addressing key issues.
- In addition, the City of Camrose's results have also been compared to Ipsos Reid's database of municipal norms (where comparable) to provide additional context, insight, and benchmarks.

### **Top-of-Mind Community Issues (cont'd)**

## Top mentions included under the three leading top-of-mind community issues:

- Transportation (31% total mentions)
  - Roads/streets (14%)
  - Public transit (13%)
  - Transportation (general) (4%)
- Taxation/Municipal Government Spending (19% total mentions)
  - Taxes/Property taxes (10%)
  - Budget/Balancing budget (10%)
- Municipal Government Services (13% total mentions)
  - Municipal Government services (general) (2%)
  - Political leadership governance (2%)





## **Change in Quality of Life Past Three Years**




Q3. And, do you feel that the quality of life in the City of Camrose in the past three years has...



### **Reasons Why Quality of Life has Worsened**





## **Satisfaction with Municipal Operations**




## **Overall Satisfaction with City Services**

## **Satisfaction with Specific City Services**







### **Balancing Taxation and Service Delivery Levels**
















## Level of Government Responsible for Health of Infrastructure in Community




