

HIGHLIGHTS

DROUGHT CHALLENGES IN CAMROSE

The City of Camrose, like many places in Alberta, is facing a water shortage this summer. This quarter, the City moved to Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Response Plan, instituting mandatory water restrictions to ensure sustainable water usage during the current conditions.

The City is taking action to reduce water use especially in parks by utilizing grey water on trees and new sod. Additionally, the sports fields watering is done prior to 9am to reduce evaporation. The Camrose Golf Course optimizes water use through an automated system that reduces evaporation and over-watering. The Golf Course does not use potable water from the City's supply. The course has its own provincial license to divert water from Mirror Lake which currently has stable water levels.

BUILDING PERMITS SEASONALITY

Building permits experience strong seasonality with many smaller projects commencing in the spring and summer months (Q2/Q3). While the total value of building permits approved is lower than 2023, the number of permits approved is almost double. Lots of small projects are on the go!

DEVELOPMENT TRENDS

The surge in development permits in 2023 is having a hangover effect on 2024. While estimated construction value has continued at a steady pace in Q2, it is now tracking below the 5-year average. Estimated taxable construction value is \$8,858,000 year-to-date.

There is a strong seasonality to small permits and Q2/Q3 are substantially busier than Q1/Q4. 2024 has been on-par for minor permits compared to the last few years.
