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

## HIGHLIGHTS

#### **DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS**

The Planning and Development team are undertaking the creation of a Municipal Development Plan (MDP). MDPs are required for all municipalities in Alberta under the Municipal Government Act (MGA). The MGA specifies minimum policies that are required to be included in an MDP. An MDP identifies future development patterns within municipal boundaries, and facilitates local planning and economic growth. An MDP provides citizens and businesses information on how a municipality will address the current and future needs of the community, including growth, economic development, land use, transportationsystems.municipalservices and environmental considerations; among others. The MDP is the overarching vision document for a municipality which is supported by the municipalities master plans and studies.

In preparation of undertaking and updating the MDP, Camrose completed a growth study forecasting the population growth from 2023 until 2048. While interprovincial migration was a major driver of population

increase between 1972 and 2022, international migration has shifted to become a significant driverfrom 2018 to 2022.
